39th World Scout Conference 11th World Scout Youth Forum



The 39th World Scout Conference will be held from the 10th to 14th of January 2011 at Estação Convention Center in Curitiba, Brazil.

The World Scout Conference is the governing body, the "general assembly" of Scouting, and is composed of all the members of the World Organization: the National Scout Organizations (NSOs).

Its function is to consider the policy and standards of the

Scout Movement throughout the world, formulate the general policy of the World Organization, and take the actions required to further the purpose of the Movement.

Executive Director Robert Lynn Horne, MD, will be representing the Las Vegas International Scouting Museum in Brazil and is looking forward to seeing all of our International Scouting friends who will be in attendance.

Col. John Wilson Kolmer, MD, (1933-2003) began his scouting career in Troop 54, Salem, VA and earned his Eagle Scout rank. He continued to be involved in Scouting, wherever the Army moved him, as Asst District Comm., Roundtable Comm., and Woodbadge Course Director. He was a Vigil Honor member of the Order of the Arrow and recipient of the Silver Acorn Award. He served on the staff of many National Jamborees with great humility and pleasure. He believed in the program of the Boy Scouts of America because of the knowledge and joy it brought to his own life and

because he saw the goodness of it in the lives of other men and boys. It is with great joy that their 3 Eagle sons, John, Jr., Tom, and Dave, their daughter Kathy and his loving wife, Mary Ann Kolmer, presented John's collection of 237, early 1900's, Boy Scout novels, into the International Scouting Museum in his memory!

Hans Eric Frank was born in Austria and joined Scouting in Austria. He came to England in 1938. Soon after his arrival he also became a British Scout. Since 1940 he has carried out local leadership roles in the movement, from running a Cub Scout Pack to Assistant County Commissioner. In conjunction, while also holding a multitude of positions, i.e., UK Scout Headquarters International Commissioner and an advisor to the World Scout Bureau and author of international texts on management in Scouting.

He has been a generous financial contributor to the Scout movement in many of these countries and through his donations to the World Scout Foundation, has made numerous important projects possible. He was awarded The Bronze Wolf (the highest World Scout honor) and is member of the Baden-Powell Scout Fellowship. He has set up a charitable trust (The Eric Frank Trust) using an initial personal contribution to be followed by the bulk of his estate on his death which, together with the contributions of others, will assist international Scouting, particularly the development and strengthening of the Scouting's worldwide brotherhood.

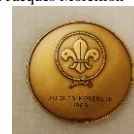

22nd World Scout Jamboree Sweden 2011 Jamboree Theme: *Simply Scouting*

Every four years, tens of thousands of Scouts, from every corner of the world, gather in a tented city for two weeks of activities and adventure! This is a fantastic event where up to 40,000 Scouts live and learn together. This is an amazing first-hand experience of multiculturalism in action, an opportunity to interact and participate with others from different cultures and to build solidarity and understanding across cultural and geographical boundaries. This is a World Scout Jamboree!

Aimed at 14 to 17 year olds, Scouts attend the event in national groups, called Contingents. There is one contingent from each country where there are Scouts recognized by the World Organization of the Scout Movement (WOSM), and currently there are 160 member countries in WOSM! The event is supported by thousands of international adult volunteers, and a special Scout solidarity fund helps to ensure that representatives attend from as many countries as possible. This is a peace building exercise on an enormous scale!
